# **New this Year! Industry Workshop**

The Industry Workshop on the afternoon of Wednesday, July 12 will feature invited speakers on "Pioneering Wine Grape Varieties Adapted to the Challenges of the East". The workshop speakers will describe new wine grape selections and cultivars as well as breeding program goals from three diverse breeding programs. Dr. John Clark and Dr. Renee Threlfall, University of Arkansas, will discuss 'Opportunity' and 'Enchantment', cultivars adapted to the warm/hot growing season of Arkansas. Dr. Matthew Clark, University of Minnesota will discuss cold hardy cultivars, including the newly released 'Itasca'. Dr. Andy Walker, University of California, Davis will describe vinifera hybrid selections from his breeding program that have very high levels of resistance to Pierce's Disease. Our call for papers will also encourage volunteered research presentations on variety evaluations occurring in the Eastern United States.

#### **Driving Directions**

FROM I-64 (EAST OR WEST): Exit 120 and follow 5th Street North 2 miles to the historic downtown. The hotel is located on the right.

FROM CHARLOTTESVILLE AIRPORT: Make a right off of Airport Road. Follow Route 29 South for 8 miles to Route 250 Bypass East. Drive two miles East on 250 Bypass. Turn right on McIntire Road. Go 7/10 mile to the second stoplight. Go through the stoplight and the hotel will be on the left.

DIRECTIONS FROM THE NORTH –VIA ROUTE 29 SOUTH: Take Route 29 South into Charlottesville to Route 250 Bypass East. Drive two miles East on 250 Bypass, and turn right onto McIntire Road. Go 7/10 mile to the second stop light. Go through the stoplight and the hotel is on the left.

DIRECTIONS FROM THE SOUTH – VIA ROUTE 29 NORTH: Take Route 29 North to Route 250 Bypass East (29 North will turn into 250 Bypass East). Drive two miles East on 250 Bypass.
