Call for Abstracts: ASEV-ES 2024 Annual Conference

Abstracts for oral and poster presentations will be reviewed and selected by the ASEV-ES Program Committee. Students are encouraged to participate in the student oral or poster presentation competitions.

Appropriate presentation topics include:

- 1) **Viticulture**, including related aspects of pest management, agronomy, agricultural engineering, economics, new products and new technologies.
- 2) **Enology**, laboratory techniques, new processing technology and products, and sensory science, including related aspects of wine chemistry, flavor chemistry, and wine microbiology.
- 3) Marketing, sales, and health related topics.
- 4) Topics pertaining to resiliency in grape and wine production that supplement the workshop.

Oral Presentations

Oral presentations will be limited to 15 minutes including time for questions. Abstracts not selected for an oral presentation may be invited to submit a poster to the poster session. More instructions will be provided on how to implement the oral presentations.

Poster Presentations

Posters will be displayed at the conference, and the presenting author will be scheduled to attend a poster session to answer questions and discuss findings. **Selected poster presenters will be invited to give 3-minute Flash Talk to summarize the poster to attendees.** More instructions will be provided on how to implement the poster presentations.

Student Oral and Poster Presentation Award Competition

The ASEV-ES recognizes and awards exceptional student research. **Two student oral presentations** and **two poster presentations** (one viticulture and one enology) will be awarded. Student oral and poster presentations will be evaluated by a committee and awards will be presented at the awards event. Presentations will be judged on scientific merit, presentation quality, and speaker's ability to respond to questions. Students may contribute more than one presentation or poster at the meeting, but only one presentation or one poster is eligible for the competition.

Student Presentation Competition: Each recipient of the Best Oral Presentation award will receive \$500.

Student Poster Competition: Each recipient of the Best Poster Presentation award will receive \$100.

Please submit abstracts online (http://asev-es.org/abstractsubmission.php) or by e-mail (info@asev-es.org) by March 15, 2024. If emailing the abstract, use Microsoft Word for the submission and attach the file to the email. A sample abstract is provided below to use to format abstracts.

A. Title:

The title will be written in title case (first letter of each word capitalized) with **bold type.** The title should reflect the important aspects of the article as concisely as possible, and preferably in no more than 100 characters and spaces. Do not use both common and scientific names in the title.

B. By-line:

List author(s) name(s) (full first name, middle initial, and last name) beneath the title. The presenting author's name should be in **bold type**. The author to whom correspondence should be addressed should be noted with an asterisk (*). The corresponding author's address should be in a separate paragraph below the byline.

C. Abstract:

The text of the abstract (250 words maximum) should start on the next line with no paragraph indentations and should state specifically and informatively the objectives of the research and the results obtained. Do not use indefinite statements (e.g., "the results will be discussed"). **Note: Abstract will not be published in American Journal of Enology and Viticulture.**

The text of the abstract (250 words maximum) should be started on the next line with no indentation. For a uniform appearance, it is important that the title be upper and lower case followed by the author's names (full first, middle initial, and last name) with the presenting author's name in **bold face**. An asterisk (*) should denote the corresponding author. The full address of the corresponding author (affiliation, street address, zip code, country, and email) should follow the authors' names.
